

Curling BC Ranking List Criteria

The categories of athletes that are considered for ranking include men, women, junior men, and junior women. Athletes are ranked individually and points are awarded based on performance in the last four years of competition.

- Team points are divided by four and awarded to each player on the team.
- Points will be retained for four years.
- Athletes receive a cumulative point's total.
- Championship points are to be weighted and reduced by 25% per year.
- CTRS points are awarded and are to be reduced by 25% a year starting in 2008.
- Able-bodied and wheelchair athletes have separate ranking lists.
- CWG teams will receive points
- Optimist International teams will receive points
- Youth Olympics team members will receive points
- 5th players who play more than 2 games on a rotating player team will receive points
- 5th players who play less than 2 games will not receive points

Note: When U21 athletes age out, their U21 points will then be moved to adult. If they play in adult while still U21, the adult list will only show points that were earned in that division
