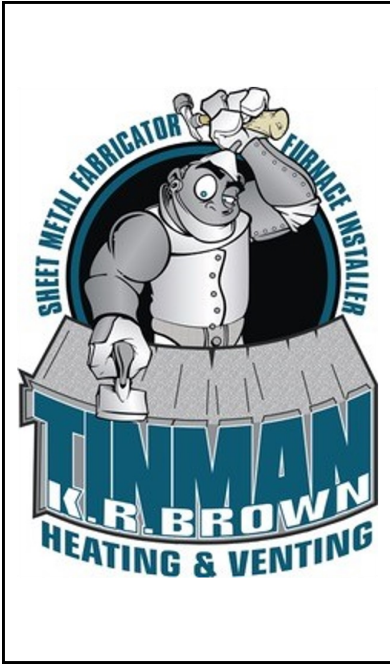

Curling has existed in British Columbia since 1895. The first clubs were located in Kaslo and Golden, in the Kootenays.

Since most of the early clubs were in the Kootenays, those wishing to compete in a bonspiel from other areas of the province had to travel by train and stagecoach to get to their destination, usually in extreme temperatures. The logistics of travel for curlers was particularly complicated by the necessity of transporting curling rocks. Many curlers had two sets to accommodate different ice conditions!

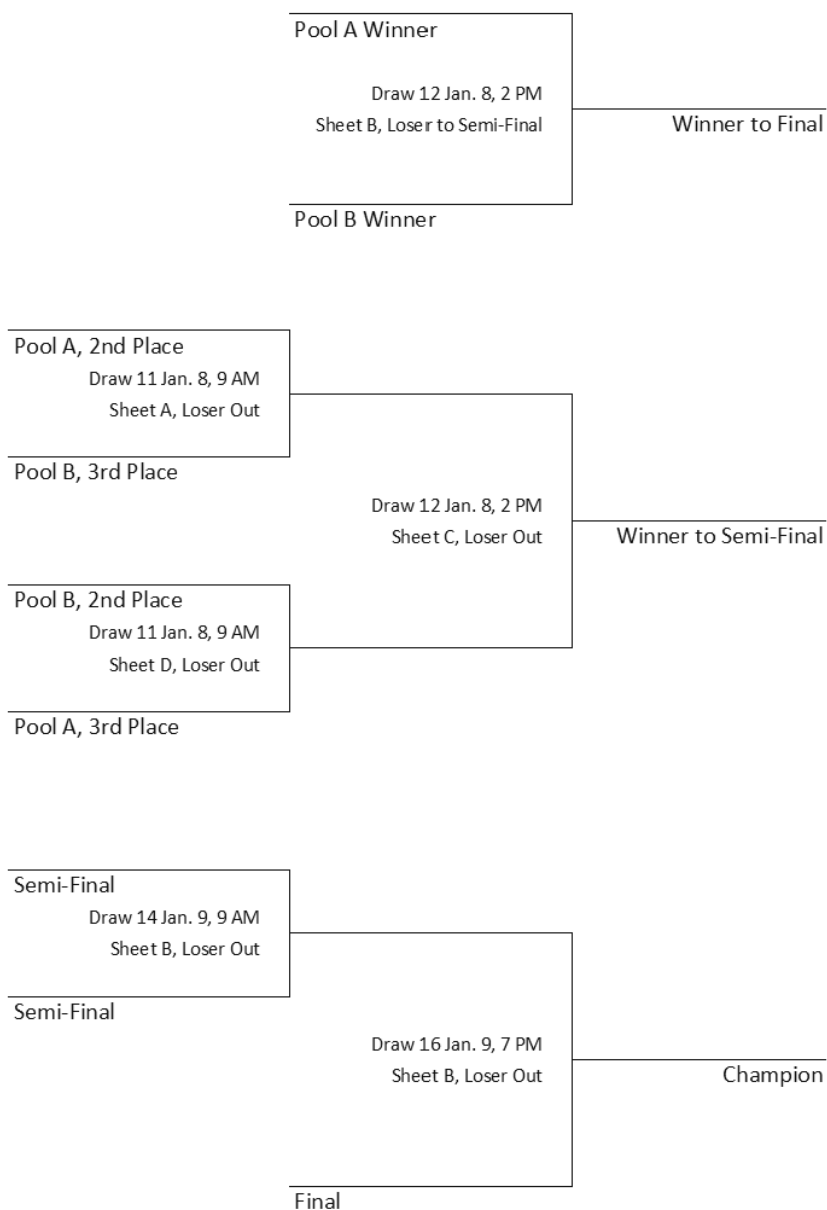

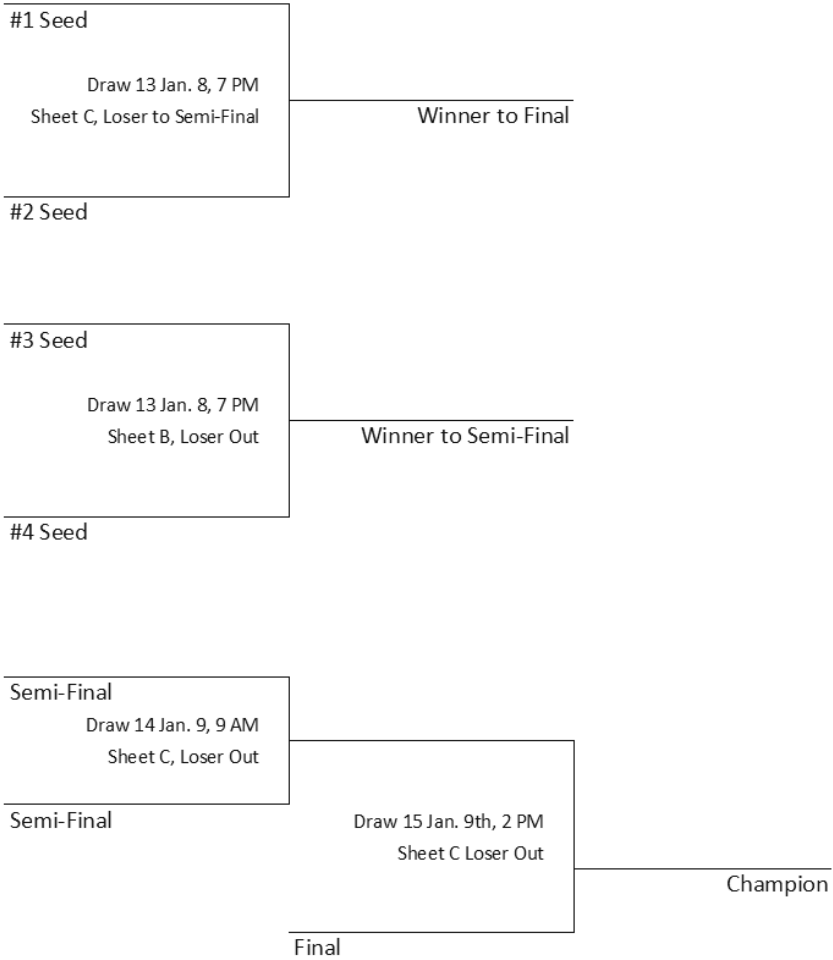
1949-50: Kamloops Curling Club opens;

Men's Playoff Draw



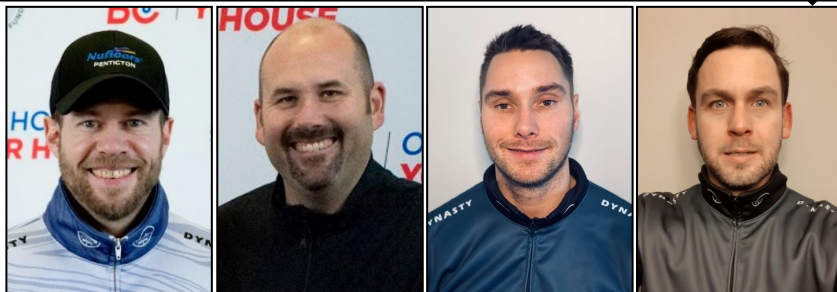

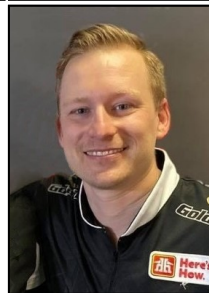

DID YOU KNOW?
