

Mixed Doubles Marker Template

Making the marks

Use a cordless drill to make the marks, and drill down approximately 3/8'' - 1/2''. If the mark is meant to be permanent, a small wad of yarn can be stuffed into the hole and then fill with water. For a more temporary type of mark, a common drywall insert can be used, and once competition is done the insert can be removed and the hole can be filled with water.

Using the template

- Measure from the top of the house on the center line and place a mark at 54", 90", and 126".
- Line up the template with the centerline and align the #1 position with the mark at 54", and the #2 position with the mark at 90".
- Place a mark on the #3 and #4 position while someone holds it in place. The mark at position #4 should be made approximately where line #2 and line #4 would intersect in the space provided.
- Slide the template down the center line and align the #1 position with the mark at 90", and the #2 position with the mark at 126".
- Place a mark on the #5 position. The mark at position #5 should be made approximately where line #2 and line #5 would intersect in the space provided.
- In total you should have now made 6 marks, 3 on the centerline, and 3 on one power play line.
- Flip the template over and repeat the process for the other power play line.
