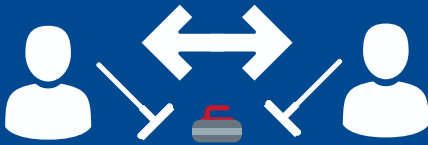
MODIFIED 4-PERSON CURLING



- 2m physical distancing between all curlers.



- One sweeper at a time.



- If your team chooses to relay, 2m physical distancing must occur.



- Skips discuss shots with Thirds while physically distant.



- Avoid shouting when moving past other curlers.



- We strongly recommend you wear a mask. Bring at least two masks as they may become wet.

Play example

Here is one example of how to decide who is either rotated out or who is the designated secondary sweeper after the hogline:

Lead

Rock 1: 2nd sweeps, 3rd sits or takes over at hogline.

Rock 2: 3rd sweeps, 2nd prepares for delivering their stone.

Second

Rock 1: 3rd sweeps, Lead sits.

Rock 2: Lead sweeps, 3rd prepares for delivering their stone or takes over at hogline.

Third

Rock 1: Lead sweeps, 2nd sits or takes over at hogline.

Rock 2: 2nd sweeps, Lead sits or takes over at hogline.

Skip

Rock 1: Lead sweeps, 3rd calls line, 2nd sits or takes over at hogline.

OR 2nd sweeps, Lead calls line, 3rd sits or takes over at hogline.

OR 3rd sweeps, 2nd calls line, Lead sits or takes over at hogline.

Rock 2: Lead sweeps, 3rd calls line, 2nd sits or takes over at hogline.

OR 2nd sweeps, Lead calls line, 3rd sits or takes over at hogline.

OR 3rd sweeps, 2nd calls line, Lead sits or takes over at hogline.



The above rules are in place for four-person curling while Curl BC is in Phase 2 or 3 in the Return to Curling Plan. Check www.curlbc.ca for the latest information.
