ABOUT HIT DRAW TAP

Hit Draw Tap (HDT) is a youth skills competition where kids age 6-12 compete as individuals. HDT will group kids into three different age categories, and perform three different shots – a “Hit”, a “Draw” & a “Tap”.

Curling centres all across the province / territory are encourage to host an HDT competition as part of their Youth Programming or whenever it best suits your centre.

All competition results are entered into the Curling Canada database for National Scoring!

The top participants will be compared to those in similar age groups from Member Centres across Canada on a “National Leaderboard” found on hitdrawtap.ca.

The last day of this amazing program will finish with a **provincial / territorial** showdown at the Montana’s Brier in Kelowna BC on March 1, 2025

Along the way participants will receive **certificates for participation, apparel** and a chance to get their name on the Hit Draw Tap Trophy!

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY

1. The competition is open to all youth curlers ages 6-12. Curlers will compete against each other, but in their appropriate age categories. Clubs are encouraged to host events for each age category but only the age 8-9 and 10-12 will compete to attend the Provincial Championship.
2. The three age classifications are based upon the child's age as of December 31, 2024.
3. All participants may be asked to show proof of age at the Provincial level of competition.
4. Participants may enter a club competition as many times as they wish, club registration rules apply for each entry.
5. All participants' guardians must complete a Hit Draw Tap Participant Registration Form/Assumption of Risk Form. Forms can be found at <https://www.curlbc.ca/youth-programs/hit-draw-tap/>
6. Entry fee is paid to the host club (if applicable).

2024-2025 Age Categories (as of December 31, 2024)

If you were born in:	You are in group:
2018, 2017	Age 6-7
2016, 2015	Age 8-9
2014, 2013, 2012	Age 10-12

RULES

1. No brushing is allowed during the competition.
2. Regulation curling rocks (i.e. no Little Rocks or Lite Rocks) are to be used by all age categories.
3. Sheet Modifications for each age group must be used. See page 7.
4. Someone (parent, volunteer or other curler) can hold the broom for the thrower.
5. All participants must wear head protection deemed appropriate by club organizers, clean running shoes or curling shoes.
6. All participants' guardians must sign the Participant Registration Form/Assumption of Risk Form before participating in any Hit Draw Tap competition. Forms can be found at <https://www.curlbc.ca/youth-programs/hit-draw-tap/>
7. Each participant is allowed two practice shots (participant can choose whether they practice draws or hits) prior to their shots being scored.
8. **Provincial / territorial** finalists will be given access to the ice for a 10-minute open practice session.
9. Scores are cumulative per event, with each participant repeating each score five times
10. Ties at the club and provincial / territorial level will be broken to determine 1st, 2nd and 3rd with a "sudden death" draw to the button – draw is repeated until winner is determined. Officials will measure the distance from the pin to determine the winner.
11. If at any point a decision cannot be made as to the score of a shot, the decision shall always favour the participant.

MEMBER CENTRE REGISTRATION



Curling Centres are to register their event online with their Member Association by clicking Centre Registration Form. This form can be found here <https://www.curlbc.ca/youth-programs/hit-draw-tap/>

Registration should be made by the person who will be responsible for the event, that person will be given “User” rights in the Online-Scoring App.

SKILLS AND SCORING



Pre Competition Practice:

It is recommended that each participant be permitted a maximum of two practice shots or an open practice time – whichever best suits the centre. An open practice of 10 minutes will be permitted at the Provincial / Territorial Shootout.

Scoring:

Each athlete will have **five attempts** at each shot. The score is cumulative. In all situations, if a score cannot be clearly determined, the decision shall be made in the favour of the participant (i.e. round up to the higher of the two scores).

Game / Sheet Modification

- Ages 6-7 | Short Game - From the hack to the near house in a “short game” format.
- Ages 8-9 | **NEW** - Half sheet length
 - Option #1:
 - Placing a movable hack halfway down a sheet and throwing from it towards the house.
 - Option #2:
 - Pre-installed halfway house (throwing towards a full sized house, halfway down the ice)
 - *In both options, curlers must release the rock before the hogline.*
- Ages 10-12 | Full sheet length

THE HIT



Goal	Hit the positioned rock and stay in the rings		
Age Group	Age 6-7	Age 8-9	Age 10-12
Modifications	Short Game	Half Length	Full Length
Special Rules	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Must keep their hack foot in their designated hack (i.e. right-handed thrower uses left hack) - Contact with the pre-set stone must be made for any points to count, the stone does not have to be removed from play 		
Set-up	Rock to be hit, is set up just behind the button.		
Scoring	<p>Points are assigned by where the thrown rock rolls to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 5 points if it touches the button • 4 points if it rolls but touches the four foot • 3 points if it rolls touches the eight foot • 2 points if it rolls touches the 12 foot • 1 point if contact with the set stone is made. Stone does not have to be removed from play.

THE DRAW



Goal	Draw as close to the pin as possible.		
Age Group	Age 6-8	Age 8-9	Age 10-12
Modifications	Short Game	Half Length	Full Length
Special Rules	- Must keep their hack foot in their designated hack (i.e. right-handed thrower uses left hack)		
Set-up	None		
Scoring	<p>Points are assigned by where the thrown rock stops:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 5 points if it covers the pin hole • 4 points if it touches the button • 3 points if it touches the four foot • 2 points if it touches the eight foot • 1 point if it touches the 12 foot

THE TAP



Goal	Promote a rock from the 12' to the button.		
Age Group	Age 6-8	Age 8-9	Age 10-12
Modifications	Short Game	Half Length	Full Length
Special Rules	- Must keep their hack foot in their designated hack (i.e. right-handed thrower uses left hack)		
Set-up	Rock is positioned bisecting the centre line, at the top of the rings.		
Scoring	<p>Points are assigned by where the tapped rock stops:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 5 points if it touches the button • 4 points if it touches the four foot • 3 points if it touches the eight foot • 2 points if it touches the 12 foot • 1 point if contact is made but the rock goes through the rings

REPORTING SCORES



A Web based Scoring Application will be available.

The instructions/access to this tool will be sent to the Member Centre's Event Coordinator.

If you do not have access to internet while on the ice, you may want to utilize a Manual Record Form. You will then need to transcribe the information into the Web based Scoring Application for the information to appear on the provincial leaderboard.

All results must be entered by **January 27, 2025.**

Prizes and Advancement

Centre Prizes

1) Each HDT Participant in the centre will receive a Participation Certificate.

- These will be included in your HDT Hosting Kit.

2) 1st, 2nd & 3rd place finishers of each age division (6-7, 8-9, 10-12) will receive ribbons.

3) 1st, 2nd & 3rd place finishers of each age division (6-7, 8-9, 10-12), at the Provincial Shootout, will receive a medal.

PROVINCIAL / TERRITORIAL SHOOTOUT

- Top 5 participants (based on total score) + ties in the age categories 8-9, and 10-12 will advance to **Provincial Championship (at the Brier) on March 1 at 8:30 am.**
- Participants are responsible for all travel costs to get to and from the event.
- If a Top 5 participant cannot attend the provincials / territorials, their spot will be forfeited and filled by the next highest score on the leaderboard. Any remaining unfilled spots and the 6-7 age categories will be filled through the Kelowna local curling community.

Provincial / Territorial Shootout | Member Centres that have participants who have qualified for provincials will receive an email communication on **February 3, 2025** to confirm your child's attendance at the provincials. Parents or guardians will have until **February 5, 2025** to confirm their participants entry. After this date/time the participant spot will be forfeited and the next highest score will be invited.

All Provincial Participants will receive;

- Toque or Tee Shirt.
- Tickets to the March 1 afternoon or evening Brier game
- Winners will get medals (top 3 in each category)
